
Hello, Miss Ritu!






My name is Lin Tsz Nga. I am six years old. I am in class 1E.

This is Miss Au. She is my class teacher. She is nice and beautiful.


This is Shing Chun. She is our monitress. She is six years old. She is a good girl.



There are many students in the corridor.





Today is the thirtieth of December. It is freezing. Kiki wants to go outside and build a snowman. She is very happy because she can build a snowman and go outside.


