Before they left, our principal invited all of us to share our feelings and say, 'thanks'. After that our principal gave them some souvenirs. Then, we went to the ground floor to take photos.

I was very happy because I could play games with a beautiful visitor. In this way, I can learn English easily.

Tung Chung Cotholic School

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
